Proposal #2 Junior 19 Championships.	78%	Agreed
Proposal #3 Suspend Championship Extinction rule	98%	Agreed
Proposal #4 No Points for Championships before July 2021	95%	Agreed
Proposal #5 Novice 2020 eligible to row in Novice Championships 2021	86%	Agreed
Proposal #6 Championships closing date extension.	98%	Agreed
** Requires a two thirds majority to pass.
