## Schedule 1

## Part 1 Relevant Work or Activities Relating to Children

1.

<u>Any work or activity</u> which is carried out by a person, <u>a necessary and regular part</u> of which consists mainly of the person having access to, or contact with, children in—

- (a) an establishment which provides <u>pre-school services</u> within the meaning of Part VII of the Child Care Act 1991,
- (b) a school or centre of education, both within the meaning of the Education Act 1998,
- (c) any <u>hospital or health care centre</u> which receives, treats or otherwise provides services to children,
- (d) a <u>designated centre</u> within the meaning of <u>section 2 of the Health Act 2007</u>, in so far as it relates to an institution at which <u>residential services</u> are provided in accordance with the Child Care Act 1991,
- (e) <u>a special care unit</u> provided and maintained in accordance with section 23K of the Child Care Act 1991,
- (f) a children detention school within the meaning of section 3 of the Children Act 2001,
- (g) a <u>reception or accommodation centre</u> which provides <u>residential accommodation</u> services to applicants for <u>asylum</u> under contract to the Department of Justice and Equality.

2.

Any work or activity which consists of the provision of home tuition by a person pursuant to the Scheme administered and funded by the Department of Education and known as the <a href="Home Tuition">Home Tuition</a>
Scheme.

3.

Any work or activity which consists of <u>treatment</u>, <u>therapy or counselling</u> provided to a child by a person in the course of that work or activity.

4.

Any work or activity which consists of <u>care or supervision</u> of children <u>unless</u> the care or supervision is <u>merely incidental</u> to the care or supervision of persons who are not children.

Any work or activity which consists of the <u>provision of educational, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities (whether or not for commercial or any other consideration)</u> to children <u>unless</u> the provision of educational, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities is <u>merely incidental</u> to the provision of educational, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities to persons who are not children.

6.

Any work or activity which consists of the provision of <u>advice, guidance or developmental services</u> (<u>including by means of electronic interactive communications</u>) to children <u>unless</u> the provision of the advice, guidance or developmental service is <u>merely incidental</u> to the provision of those services to persons who are not children.

7.

Any work or activity <u>as a minister or priest or any other person</u> engaged in the <u>advancement of any religious beliefs</u> to children <u>unless</u> such work or activity is <u>merely incidental</u> to the advancement of religious beliefs to persons who are not children.

8.

Work as a <u>driver of a public service vehicle</u> which is being used <u>only</u> for the purpose of conveying children.

9.

The <u>provision</u> by a person, whether or not for commercial or other consideration, of <u>accommodation for a child in his or her own home.</u>

10.

<u>Any research work or activities</u> (howsoever described) carried out <u>in a university, institute of technology or other establishment at which third level education</u> is provided where <u>a necessary and regular part</u> of the research work or activity <u>involves contact with or access to</u> children.

11.

Any application by a person to carry on or manage a designated centre within the meaning of section 2 of the Health Act 2007.

12.

<u>Any application</u> by a person for a <u>declaration of eligibility and suitability</u> within the meaning of <u>section 3 of the Adoption Act 2010</u>.

13.

<u>Any assessment</u> of a person's <u>suitability to act as a foster carer</u> by or under <u>section 39</u> of the Child Care Act 1991.

14.

<u>Any assessment</u> by or under <u>section 41</u> of the Child Care Act 1991 of a <u>person's suitability to act as</u> <u>a carer</u> of a child in respect of whom he or she is a <u>relative</u>.

<u>Any work or activity</u> which is carried on by a person, <u>a necessary and regular part</u> of which <u>requires</u> the person to have <u>access to, or contact with</u>, children pursuant to the following enactments:

- (a) Medical Practitioners Act 2007;
- (b) Nurses Act 1985;
- (c) Nurses and Midwives Act 2011;
- (d) Dentists Act 1985;
- (e) Health and Social Care Professionals Act 2005;
- (f) Pharmacy Act 2007;
- (g) Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council Order 2000 (S.I. No. 109 of 2000);
- (h) Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (Establishment) Order 2000 (Amendment)

Order 2004 (S.I. No. 575 of 2004).

## Part 2 Relevant Work or Activities Relating to Vulnerable Persons

1.

<u>Any work or activity</u> which is carried out by a person, <u>a necessary and regular part</u> of which consists <u>mainly</u> of the person having access to, or contact with, vulnerable persons in—

- (a) <u>a school or centre of education</u>, both within the meaning of the Education Act 1998, <u>unless</u>, <u>in the case of a centre of education</u>, the work or activity is <u>merely incidental</u> to work or activities undertaken in relation to persons who are not vulnerable persons,
- (b) <u>any hospital or care centre</u> which receives, treats or otherwise which provides services to vulnerable persons,
- (c) <u>a designated centre</u> within the meaning of <u>section 2 of the Health Act 2007</u>, in so far as it relates to an institution at which <u>residential services</u> are provided to vulnerable persons,
- (d) an approved centre within the meaning of Part 5 of the Mental Health Act 2001.

2.

Any work or activity which consists of <u>treatment</u>, <u>therapy or counselling</u> provided to a vulnerable person by a person in the course of that work or activity.

3.

Any work or activity which consists of the <u>care (including the provision of health and personal social services and essential domestic services)</u> of vulnerable persons <u>unless</u> the care is <u>merely incidental</u> to the care of persons who are not vulnerable persons.

4.

Any work or activity which consists of the <u>provision of educational, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities (whether or not for commercial or any other consideration)</u> to vulnerable persons <u>unless</u> the provision of educational, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities is <u>merely incidental</u> to the provision of educational, training, cultural, recreational, leisure, social or physical activities to persons who are not vulnerable persons.

5.

Any work or activity which consists of the provision of <u>advice, guidance or developmental services</u> (<u>including by means of electronic interactive communications</u>) to vulnerable persons <u>unless</u> the provision of the advice, guidance or developmental service is <u>merely incidental</u> to the provision of those services to persons who are not vulnerable persons.

6.

Work as a <u>driver of a public service vehicle</u> which is being used <u>only</u> for the purpose of conveying vulnerable persons.

7.

Any work or activity <u>as a minister or priest or any other person</u> engaged in the <u>advancement of any religious beliefs</u> to vulnerable persons <u>unless</u> such work is <u>merely incidental</u> to the advancement of religious beliefs to persons who are not vulnerable persons.

The <u>provision</u> by a person, whether or not for commercial or other consideration, of <u>accommodation for a vulnerable person in his or her own home</u>.

9.

Any research work or activities (howsoever described) carried out <u>in a university, institute of technology or other establishment at which third level education</u> is provided where <u>a necessary and regular part</u> of the research work or activity <u>involves contact with or access to</u> vulnerable persons.

10.

<u>Any assessment</u> of a person's <u>suitability</u> to act as a <u>care representative</u> under <u>section 21 of the</u> Nursing Homes Support Scheme Act 2009.

11.

Any application by a person to carry on or manage a designated centre both within the meaning of section 2 of the Health Act 2007.

12.

<u>Any work or activity</u> which is carried on by a person, <u>a necessary and regular part</u> of which <u>requires</u> the person to have <u>access to, or contact with</u>, vulnerable persons pursuant to the following enactments:

- (a) Medical Practitioners Act 2007;
- (b) Nurses Act 1985;
- (c) Nurses and Midwives Act 2011;
- (d) Dentists Act 1985;
- (e) Health and Social Care Professionals Act 2005;
- (f) Pharmacy Act 2007;
- (g) Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (Establishment) Order 2000 (S.I. No. 109 of 2000);
- (h) Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Council (Establishment) Order 2000 (Amendment)

Order 2004 (S.I. No. 575 of 2004).
