



Safeguarding

Rowing Ireland, including the Board of Directors and all Affiliated Clubs, acknowledges it has a duty to promote a positive experience and a safe environment for young people while participating in the sport of rowing.

The underpinning Principles are

- (A) Young people have a right to enjoy sport free from all forms of abuse and exploitation
- (B) Everybody has a responsibility to support the care and protection of young people
- (C) Rowing Ireland and its affiliated Clubs have a duty of care to young people who take part in the sport of rowing.

This ethos is reflected in our Safeguarding Policies, Rules and mandatory requirements for members and Clubs where involved with young people.
